- 7. Each entry must be accompanied by the artists name, age category and school name along with a contact address/telephone number.
- 8. The entries will be judged by a panel of judges. One overall winner, one runner-up and 3 commended entries from each category will be chosen from which an overall winner will be selected
- 9. A participant can only win the overall prize once in each competition (Primary and Secondary), they are welcome to enter and win individual prizes multiple times.
- 10. The judges' decision is final
- 11. All winners, runners-up and commended entries will receive a certificate, art equipment and other prizes, the overall winner will also claim a farm visit for their entire class and a private drawing workshop with local artist David Adam who will take the winner and a parent /guardian up the hill in an arranged vehicle from the local estate to look at and draw the scenery and wildlife.

 - Both the farm visit and drawing session will be arranged on a mutual date to suit all parties
 - The winner's art work may also be used in GWCT publications, website, and on merchandise which may be sold in aid of GWCT
