For more than 80 years the GWCT, as a leading charity, has been revolutionising the way that the British countryside is managed for the benefit of game and other wildlife. Through its research, the Trust has developed more practical solutions for managing the countryside in a sympathetic way for wildlife than probably any other organisation. The aim of the GWCT is to support those that are helping to restore our countryside and its wildlife with comprehensive practical advice backed up by science.

Although some species are showing signs of recovery, others are faring less well. GWCT research is proving pivotal in the battle to help species such as upland waders, water voles, woodcock, brown hares, Atlantic salmon and wold grey partridges.
