2017 Game & Wildlife Conservation Trust Secondary Schools' Art Competition

Rules and conditions of entry:

- 1. The competition is open to all Secondary School-aged pupils in the Perth & Kinross area.
- 2. There are two categories of the competition:
- Years 1-3 and 4-6
- 3. Entrants may only submit one piece of art into the competition each.
- 4. Entries can be received at either of the addresses below and must be submitted by Friday, 27th October at 3.30 p.m. Entries will not be accepted at either address after this time.
- 5. Each entry must be accompanied by the name, school and age category of the artist and a contact address/telephone number. Plus a title for their entry with a brief description of why they chose this particular species.
- 6. The entries will be judged by a panel of judges. One winner, one runner-up and commended entries from each category will be chosen from which an overall winner will be decided.
- 7. The judges' decision is final and no cash alternatives will be given.
- 8. All winners, runners-up and commended entries will receive a certificate, art equipment and/or other prizes. The overall winner will also claim:
 - a. The Blackadders Solicitors perpetual art trophy for his/her school to retain until the prizegiving of the following year's competition before which it must be returned to GWCT
 - b. A place on a Julian Jardine Portfolio Art Class
 - c. His/her design may also be used in GWCT publications and on merchandise to be sold in aid of the GWCT which is a charity.
- 9. Julian Jardine will host the winners on dates agreed by all parties.
- 10. All entries will be the property of GWCT and may be used for their own promotional purposes.
- 11. Press releases may be issued to launch the competition, announce the judging and for the prize-giving. Press photographers will be invited to all/some of these events.
- 12. Winners, runners-up and commended entrants will be required to attend a prize-giving on Thursday 23rd November at AK Bell Library. Parents and teachers welcome to attend. Numbers of attendees to be provided to GWCT.
- 13. Entries may be returned at the entrant's own expense or can be collected from GWCT (address overleaf) until January 26th 2018.
- 14. An exhibition of a selection of the entries will be on public display at AK Bell Library following the Prize giving.
